Call to Order - At approximately 5:00 pm on May 17, 2017, Mr. Kistner, Chairman of the Beer Board for the City of Bristol, Tennessee, called the meeting to order in the Conference Room of the Ewell L. Easley Municipal Bldg., located at 104 Eighth St., Bristol, Tennessee.

Review of Minutes - Board Members reviewed the minutes from the April 12, 2017 meeting, the minutes were approved as read.

NEW BUSINESS

Dollar General Store #17436, 1728 Weaver Pike, Bristol, TN - Mr. Mike Reedy, District Mgr. for Dolgencorp, LLC, and Mr. John Fackler, Store Mgr., appeared before the Board to request an Off Premises Permit. Capt. James advised the Application is in order and fees paid, Mr. Fackler has completed training and background checks reveal no problems. Mr. Kistner called for questions/comments from the community, there were none. Mr. Kistner asked Mr. Fackler if he has experience in alcohol sales, he related he does, he worked in the restaurant industry, attended Tennessee ABC training, and has worked in businesses serving both beer and liquor. Mr. Tickle asked where on Weaver Pike the store is located, Mr. Fackler related it is right by Belmont Lanes. There being no further questions Mr. Kistner called for a motion, Mr. Ketron made a motion to approve the Application, seconded by Mr. Tickle. There being no further discussion Mr. Kistner called for a vote. The motion was approved by unanimous vote. Mr. Kistner advised Mr. Fackler that the police do conduct stings, and that the majority of violations come from clerks that either do not read the date of birth on the ID correctly, or deliberately ignore the correct date. Mr. Fackler advised the clerk must enter the date of birth into the register before the sale can go through, Mr. Kistner advised a register that requires the ID be scanned is the best defense against mistakes, and warned him about sales to intoxicated customers also. Mr. Reedy advised if a clerk does make an underage sale it is cause for immediate termination.

PENDING BUSINESS

Capt. James advised he has one Application in hand, and requested a meeting be scheduled for June, 2017, Mr. Kistner scheduled a meeting for June 21, 2017. Mr. Kistner also reminded Board Members that the August meeting will be scheduled one week early due to race activities the third week of the month. Capt. James advised he should have a few temporary permits coming up for renewal in August, 2017.

There being no further business to conduct the meeting was adjourned.
