City Manager Announces Resignation

Jeff Broughton announced his resignation as Bristol Tennessee city manager effective June 20, 2013. He has served the City of Bristol since September 2004.

Broughton has accepted a position with the Municipal Technical Advisory Service (MTAS) in the University of Tennessee's Institute of Public Service. In that role he will work with city officials in the Nashville area providing assistance on municipal management issues facing cities.

"I am proud of the accomplishments that were jointly achieved by the city council and staff over the past nine years and have no doubt that the organization is positioned for further success in the future" said Broughton. "Significant improvements that have been made to the downtown, school system, utility systems, roads and streetscapes, and to the overall economic future and prosperity of the community; and plans that are underway for further improvements and successes," he continued.

A number of important projects were started during his tenure including the redevelopment of the downtown, construction of the new Fairmount Elementary School, numerous upgrades at Steele Creek and other city parks, preparation of a strategic economic development plan, and commencement of the Pinnacle project at Exit 74 on I-81.

Broughton is an International City Management Association credentialed manager (ICMA-CM) and has over 35 years of city management experience with cities in Tennessee, Kentucky, and Illinois.
