Trinkle Hollow Hike set for Steele Creek Park

There are parts of the 2,000 acre Steele Creek Park that are remote by most anyone's measure. Most people don't like to hike into remote areas that they are not familiar with especially by themselves. However, sometimes that is where the most beautiful scenery is to enjoy.

On Saturday, August 17th park Naturalist, Don Holt will lead a group of adventurous hikers into Trinkle Hollow, one of the more remote areas of the park where few people have trekked. The hike should take about two hours.



Anyone wanting to participate needs to bring along water and snacks for the hike that will begin at 8:00 AM. Everyone should wear comfortable shoes such as athletic shoes, hiking boots, etc. The hike will take place rain or shine. Participants may want to bring a poncho or rain gear if it looks like inclement weather. Children should be accompanied by an adult. This is a great family activity so bring everyone. Hikers are being asked to meet at Steele Creek Park Nature Center located at 80 Lakeshore Drive in Bristol, TN. There is no charge for the hike.
