

EMERGENCY SUPPLIES CHECKLIST

Survival Kit	Safety Supplies & Tools	First Aid Kit
Water (1 gallon per person per day for drinking & sanitation, stored in tightly-capped, clean plastic containers)	Heavy shoes (for everyone)	Latex/sterile gloves
First aid kit and book	Heavy gloves (for every person clearing debris)	Sterile & adhesive bandages
Essential medication/glasses	Clothes (complete change kept dry)	Cleansing Agents (isopropyl alcohol, hydrogen peroxide, soap, germicide)
Smoke alarm & portable fire extinguisher	Hat or cap (protection from sun, rain, and cold)	Eyewash solution
Flashlight (spare batteries/bulb)	Candles	Antibiotic & Burn Ointments
Escape ladder (for 2 nd story)	Matches (dipped in wax and kept in waterproof container)	Thermometer
Whistle (to signal for help)	Sharp knife, utility knife, or razor blades	Prescription medications
Radio – portable, spare batteries	Crescent wrench (turn off gas)	Over-the-counter medications including aspirin, anti-diarrheal medicine, and antacid
Food – (canned or precooked – require minimum heat and water – consider special diets for infants or elderly)	Axe, shovel, broom	Prescribed medical supplies
Manual can opener	Screwdriver, pliers, hammer	Scissors, tweezers
Food for pets	Coils of bailing wire & ½ inch rope	Petroleum jelly or other lubricant
Blankets or sleeping bags	Garden hose (for siphoning and firefighting)	Needle and safety pins
Money – traveler's checks	Cooking equipment (barbecue, hibachi, camp stove, or Sterno stove/fuel)	Sunscreen
Watch or clock (battery)	Pots & heavy-duty aluminum foil	Tongue depressors
Cell phone	Paper plates & eating utensils	Triangular bandages
In the car – full tank of gas, emergency flares, local maps	Plastic tape, pen & paper	Dropper
Sanitation Supplies	Clean Air	To Purify Water
Large plastic trash bags (for trash, waste, water protection, ground cloth)	Face masks or defense-weave cotton material that snugly covers your nose and mouth for each member of the family.	To purify drinking water, use any of the following methods:

Large trash can		Boil water 5-10 minutes
Sealable plastic bags		Add 10 drops of household bleach solution per gallon of water, mix well, and let stand for 30 minutes. A slight smell or taste of chloride indicates water is good to drink.
Hand soap & liquid soap		Add household tincture of iodine in the above manner as used with bleach.
Household bleach		Use commercial purification tablets such as Halazone or Globaline. Follow package instructions.
Personal hygiene products		Learn how to remove the water in the hot water heater and other water supplies.
